


Introduction to Brockwell Live

	<p>Bus The closest stops are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Dulwich Road• Norwood Road <p>Routes to these stops: 2, 3, 37, 68, 196, 322, 432, 468, 690.</p>
	<p>Driving</p> <p>We have an Accessible Car Park and you can request a space there using our form.</p>

Access Facilities

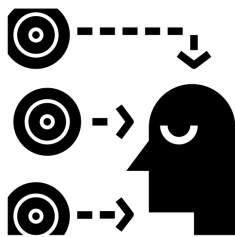
 <p>RADAR padlock</p>  <p>RADAR key</p> 	<h3>Toilets</h3> <p>We have accessible toilets at each event and use RADAR to lock our toilets.</p> <p>If you have your own key please bring it with you, if not please request one from our team.</p>
	<h3>RovoLOOtion</h3> <p>RevoLOOtion is an accessible toilet with an adult changing facility.</p>
	<h3>Accessible Viewing Platforms</h3> <p>These platforms allow you to sit down away from the crowd to enjoy performances.</p>
	<h3>Assistance Dogs</h3> <p>If you need to bring your assistance dog, please let us know in advance and we'll give you the necessary information.</p>
